LET'S BEGIN HOLY WEEK!

On Palm Sunday, Christians begin Holy Week. It is the most important week of the year because it leads us right up to Easter Sunday. The Church invites us to follow Jesus through his Passion and all the way to his Resurrection.

THE EASTER TRIDUUM

The end of Holy Week is called the Easter Triduum. Triduum is a Latin word that means "three days": Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Shortly before these three days, the Church celebrates a Christian Mass surrounded by all the priests. Before the Mass, they all receive their commitment to the Church and their service to their mothers and sisters. The bishop consecrates (makes sacred) the oils that we gather to be used at different sacraments.

On Holy Thursday, Christians remember the final meal that Jesus had with his disciples, the Last Supper. He washed their feet as a sign of love and of service. He gave them the Eucharist to nourish them with his Body and his Blood.

On Good Friday, the Church celebrates the day when Jesus died on the cross. Mass is never celebrated on this day. Instead, Christians are encouraged to make the Stations of the Cross or to participate in the Celebration of the Lord's Passion. At the latter, the story of the Passion of Jesus is read from the Gospel of John. This is followed by the special prayers for the human race and then the Adoration of the Holy Cross and Holy Communion.

Holy Saturday is a day of silence because Jesus is in the tomb. During the day there is never a Mass. But in the evening, Christians gather for the Easter Vigil. This is a long and beautiful celebration of the Resurrection that starts with the blessing of the new fire, a sign of the light that Christ brings to us. Adults who have been preparing for baptism are baptized on this night.

On Easter Sunday, the joy of the Resurrection gives rise to a great day. At Mass, Christians renew their Baptismal Promises and are sprinkled with the holy water blessed at the vigil. After the Mass, we celebrate by partaking of some of the treats we give up during Lent. The Easter Season lasts seven weeks, until Pentecost.

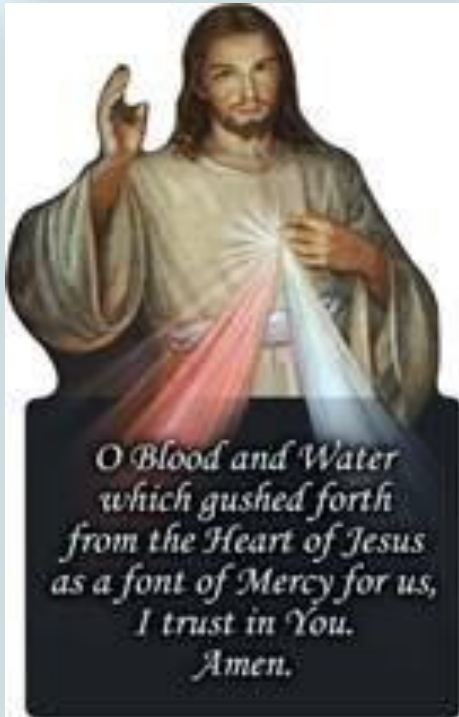
